

Introduction to School Community Councils

Every school in Saskatchewan has a School Community Council (SCC). SCCs are made up of elected and appointed parents or guardians and community members. They work to advance the educational objectives of their school. In 2006, SCCs replaced all legislated district (local) boards of trustees and local school advisory committees throughout Saskatchewan.

SCCs work with parents and community to develop shared responsibility for the learning success and well-being of all children and youth. They encourage and facilitate the involvement of youth, parents and the community in school planning and improvement processes.

Any parent or guardian of a student who attends the school or any community member who is an elector (as defined in *The Local Government Election Act*) and lives within the attendance area for that school is eligible to run for an elected position on the SCC.
