# SCHOOL DIVISION PROFILE

The Lloydminster Public School Division is a very complex organization, in that it is both a Saskatchewan and Alberta school division. The Lloydminster Public School Division (LPSD) follows the Saskatchewan curriculum and reports primarily to the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education. It also receives funding from Alberta Education to support a number of student learning and facility initiatives. This complex environment creates an opportunity for the division to simultaneously glean the best from two provinces. LPSD has five elementary schools, one kindergarten to grade 9 school, two middle schools, one high school, and one outreach school. All of our schools offer students a well-rounded education based on curricula provided by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education. Students who attend our schools not only receive excellent curricular instruction, but also benefit from extensive co-curricular and extracurricular opportunities.

## SCHOOL DIVISION IN THE COMMUNITY

## The Board of Education places strong emphasis on community and parent involvement

#### Community Involvement

Lloydminster Public School Division is an integral part of community life in west central Saskatchewan. The division as a whole, and individual schools are linked to the broader community in a multitude of ways. The Board of Education places strong emphasis on community and parent involvement, and on community partnerships.

#### Community and Parent Involvement

Research has shown that students achieve at higher levels in school when their families and other community members are involved in education. The schools of Lloydminster Public School Division all have programs and initiatives to encourage community and parent involvement. These programs vary from school to school and are unique to each school community.



#### **Community Partnerships**

Lloydminster Public School Division and individual schools within the division have established a range of formal and informal community partnerships in order to promote student learning and ensure that our students' school experience is positive and successful. Some examples of these partners include Lakeland College, the City of Lloydminster, Vic Juba Theatre, the Native Friendship Center, the Lloydminster Region Health Foundation, FOPA (Friends of the Performing Arts) and the Junior A Bobcats Hockey.

LPSD uses an integrated services model in which we partner with social service agencies to ensure that students' physical, social, and psychological needs are met. This approach recognizes that students who are healthy and happy have greater capacity to learn and succeed in school and life.

LPSD has established partnerships with organizations that focus on improving the mental health and wellness of our students. Strong Healthy Individuals Navigating Emotions (SHINE) is a partnership with Alberta Health Services and Lloydminster Catholic School Division (LCSD) that places SHINE workers in each LPSD elementary school. These workers deliver whole classroom programming to focus on building mental health capacity with kindergarten to grade 6 students.

Several schools in LPSD have partnered with local businesses. The purpose of these partnerships is to enrich students' educational experiences and help them connect what they learn at school to the world of work. Typically, the partner business provides job shadowing opportunities for students and sends representatives to the schools to talk about their business or industry.

Lloydminster Public School Division provided leadership in establishing the School Resource Officer position within both Lloydminster school divisions. This position was created in partnership with the Lloydminster Region Health Foundation, Lloydminster RCMP, and the City of Lloydminster in an effort to provide supports to all students. We look forward to enhancing this position and continuing to allocate resources to students inside our division.

# STRATEGIC PRIORITY READING, WRITING, AND MATH

**85% of students** at or above grade level in reading for Grade 3

**75% of students** at or above grade level in writing for Grade 4, 7 and 9

80% of students at or above grade level in math for Grade 2, 5 and 8





## **STRATEGIC ACTIONS**

## LPSD is committed to improving student achievement and teacher practice in the areas of Reading, Writing, and Math.

#### LPSD focus:

- Address learning gaps for students grades 1-9
- Continue to improve teacher practice and student achievement in the areas of reading and writing
- Address the learning gaps of students in Grades 1-9

- Teacher support in literacy and math instruction
- Continue with the Elementary Admin Literacy team. Continue with the Middle Years Literacy Intervention team
- Grades 1-6 teachers utilize commonly used rubrics to assess students' progress
- Grades 7-9 teachers utilize the LPSD rubrics to determine where students are at
- Provide opportunities for teachers to develop pre-tests and/or design instruction to incorporate previous grade essential teachings
- Provide PD for guided math instruction to teachers (includes pre-testing)
- Collaborate with administrators to present math expectations in the fall and follow up to support teachers for Grades 1-9

## STRATEGIC PRIORITY GRADUATION RATES

We are proud to have 85% of our students graduate on-time. Increasing the number of graduating students is a major focus for LPSD. Through the implementation of innovative pathways, increasing student engagement, and sense of belonging, we anticipate a significant improvement in our graduation rates.

- Close learning gaps for all students in Grades 10-12
- Increase the number of students graduating, with emphasis on improving the 3-year grad rate
- Extend innovative pathways and programming

- Implement strong Professional Learning Communities
- Provide Coordinator support for PLCs and teacher practice
- Provide support and PD as necessary for teachers to develop pre- and post-assessments and/or design targeted instruction to support lagging skills
- Support school data team processes and structures
- Provide platform for data compilation and analysis

- Communicate regularly with administrators to review progress toward school tech goal
